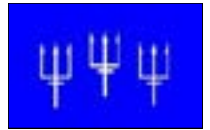

We continue working hard on making 2026 a banner year for our Education Department. Our April 18-19 America's Boating Course® (ABC) was a success, and we graduated 13 new Certificate Boaters. It was a great group, and we gained four new members from the class this time. We are all looking forward to the next ABC on August 15-16 at Eastwood Community Church, located centrally at the corner of Eastwood and Cardinal. The church has done a great job for us, and we thank them very much for their support!

## 2026 GREENFIELD LAKE KAYAK TRIP P/Lt/C Steve Thompson, SN

According to [NCWildlife.gov](http://NCWildlife.gov), the top five locations to find alligators in North Carolina are as follows: Greenfield Lake (Wilmington), Orton Pond (Brunswick County), Lake Waccamaw State Park (Columbus County), Alligator River National Wildlife Refuge (Dare/Tyrell County), and Cape Fear River (Lower Basin.) We are so fortunate to be able to paddle with the alligators, and that's what we



(I) did on the 21<sup>st</sup> of April. A majestic animal that first appeared on earth about 37 million years ago (give or take a couple thousand years) and really haven't changed much in the last 8 million years, they are relatively harmless. If you leave them alone, they will leave you alone. You just have to figure out how far their personal space extends.

Some other interesting facts about the alligator in North Carolina: they don't grow as fast as alligators further south, about four inches a year if it's under six feet (a mature alligator) and only about an inch each year thereafter. But that is an average as female alligators in North Carolina typically grow up to nine feet, while males can reach 11 to 13 feet. In an ideal habitat they can live from 60 to 80 years. Judging from the sizes of the alligators I saw on this paddle, there are some old gators in Greenfield Lake.



Although no one from our squadron showed up, there was another group of paddlers from the Del Webb community. Excitement was in the air as we found six or seven alligators, along with several species of birds and the ever-present turtles sunning on old tree branches.

Because the lake is so vibrant and filled with nutrients, there is a constant issue with algae and plants growing on top and in the water. Every now and then this excess growth needs to be removed. This was also in process that day; check out the picture.



I'm thinking of May 23 for the next trip. We will be going to Masonboro Island, crossing the ICW from Trails End Park, departing about 9:30 am. That is, unless this article has sparked increased interest in Greenfield Lake, in which case I will gladly revisit the wildlife it possesses. 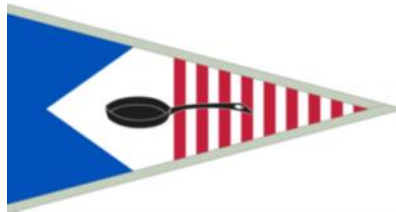
